#### Tape Dock for January ... 2006

We will have two new tapes/DVD's for rent this month.

He goes into great detail on all facets of bowl turning, from chain sawing the log to the final finishing of the bottom of the bowl. This tape is a rather long one, about 2 hours and 20 minutes.


