Ordering Online

If you had an e-mail address submitted to us by your club representative you will automatically receive an e-mail notification from Hartville Tool welcoming you to the program as soon as you are enrolled. Once you get the e-mail you should go to our web site (www.hartvilletool.com) and log in under "My Account". The site should recognize your e-mail address automatically and pop it in the top line. Unless you were a prior customer who had previously set up an account, you will not have a password and should click on "Forgot Password" just below. Within a few minutes our system will send out a temporary password. You should use that to get in, and then you may edit it to whatever you wish.

You must log in to see and receive the discount when ordering online. The discount is shown once an item is dropped into the Shopping Cart. If an item is on sale or clearance, you will be given which ever is the better deal - either the sale price or the discount (but not both).

If you are not initially set-up for web ordering, but later decide you would like to order online, please call us at 800-345-2396 with your e-mail address. Once we add your e-mail address to your customer file an e-mail will be automatically sent notifying you that your online account has been activated, and you can begin ordering as outlined above.

NOTE: Members sometimes do not get notifications due to several reasons, including: 1) E-Mail address changes since we received the list; 2) Incorrect e-mail supplied; 3) Mis-typing at entry; 4) Spam blocks. Members who suspect a problem in this regard should give us a call so we can correct the problem.

To help ensure that you receive the special discounted club pricing when ordering by phone, fax, or mail, you should be sure mention that you are a Club Discount Program participant.

Items for sale

Harvey has two sizes of Dale Nish scrapers that will be very useful for the ornament class in September. They can be used for hollowing the ornaments and getting a consistent 1/8 inch wall. You can buy them for Harvey's cost of \$46 each (usually about \$54).

1. Hitachi 13 inch wide, thickness Planer. New, never used. With stand, casters, and leveling legs. Manual included. \$245
2. Power generator, Genrac 4KW continuous (B&S engine), with control panel and digital voltmeter. About 12 to 14 years old. Only used for hurricane backup. Manual included. \$275
3. Power generator, General Power 6KW continuous. Never used (bought large unit for entire home). Manual included. \$480

Bob Beswick – cedar toothpick holder with lid. Raise the lid and the toothpicks are raised for easy access.

Terry Justice – Southern yellow pine vase rescued from a cracked situation by cutting apart and gluing to form a nice vase.

Dave Search – a gimble mounted clock that he calls a 'political clock' because it is crooked and it can lean to the left or lean to the right. It is made out of Walnut and maple. If you turn it around you see a picture of his dog.

Harvey Driver – in accord with our new guidelines for show and tell to allow more time for the demonstrators, Harvey brought several bowls but picked out only one to describe. This one was made from Florida soft maple. The others may be seen on the side table.

Julian Pharis – spalted oak click pen in the Gatsby style.

SMALL HIERLOOM TOOL

(Bedan-AWL- Screwdriver etc..)

Materials;

- (1) Find suitable dry handel material (approx. 2 X 2 X 3)
- (2) A steel rod 3/16 (approximately) of Tool Steel.
- (3) Ferrell Material of Copper or Brass
Suggested tubing or Stop Nut.
* *Stop Nuts can be turned down with Spindle Gauge.*
- (4) EPOXY
- (5) Sand Paper 100-----1500
- (6) Finishing Material (of your choice)
 - a. Oil (mineral)
 - b. Watco (needs to be dried and buffed)
 - c. Wipe on Poly Eurathane

Tools;

Standard truning tools such as Roughing gauge, Spindle Gauge, Parting tool, Skew Chisel, Drill Bit, Jacobs Chuck, and Sanding Equipment.

Procedure;

Place stock between centers.

Make Tenon for Chuck, using roughing gauge.

Turn basic desired shape,

Measure length needed for the Ferrell

* (Make tight fit on Tenon)

Add Ferrell to Tenon and sand down the Ferrell (or turn down the nut)

Measure and drill opening for Steel Rod

Tool

Page 2 of

Using Jacobs Chuck in tail stock, bore the hole in handle
* (slow speed, don't over heat)

Finish turning the handle. Finish and Polish the Ferrell
* (Careful to keep wood dust off of handle)

Cut appropriate length of steel rod * (approx. 6 inches)

Grind appropriate taper on the tip.

Sand through the grit to the basic desired surface

Heat treat if needed. *(Check out a good basic knife making book)

Roughen area of steel to be inserted into handle

Epoxy rod into the handle and sharpen if applicable

(Steel can be obtained at your local hardware store.)

Part off the tool and sand end of handle! You are done!
