Vice President: Bruce Lansdowne –

Nova (Teknatool) came over from St. Pete to demonstrate tools. Anthia (?) came from the New Zealand offices. Peter is from the R&D office in St. Pete and Andrew does customer service. Nova has three offices around the world – the New Zealand office is the head office, the office in the U.S, (because they are trying to grow the U.S. Market), and an office in China which focuses on baseline R&D and supply sourcing. They currently sell to 19 countries worldwide.

Nova is proud to be celebrating 30 years of Nova in the USA. In 1987, Nova brought a 4-jaw self centering chuck to the U.S., which took the market by storm.

New chuck that they have developed is their largest chuck yet – the Titan 3.

Customer service has been too patchy, so they have taken steps to improve it.

Build relationships with local clubs, because they don't design products in isolation.

In September, there will be an engineering version of the Voyager.

Spencer from their R&D division then demonstrated Nova's new drill press. They started with Joel (a single person) & now have 17 people in their company. Spencer presented a1-3/4 horsepower direct drive drill press. It has an electronic depth sensor accurate to 0.001 inches. They haven't been able to bog down the drill. You can download new firmware with the cable provided, Speed range is from 50 RPM to 5,500 RPM. You can actually perform some router operations at this speed. You can customize the display. Their display recommends the suggested speed for the size of your drill bit & the material you are drilling. The screen shows the current location of the spindle. The drill press has f1-f4, so you can program 4 different speeds from 50 to 5,500 RPM. They recommend a surge protector, but not GFI outlets. He demonstrated electronic braking. If any new version of firmware is developed, it can be downloaded via your computer.

Russ Bremmer said he uses a "white out" pen to put marks on his tool rest, drill bits, or hollowing tool. It works better than a pencil or a Sharpie because it is not a permanent mark. After you put a mark on with white out, you can remove the mark to eliminate confusion. You can also use white out tape.
